Minutes:

Meeting was called to order at 4:02 by Chris Miller.

Motion was made by Mr. Miller and second by Chief Sanders to waive the reading of the minutes from the Fall 2021 Safety and Security Council Meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Miller gave a report to the committee on the CBISD emergency alert system. CBISD uses Skyward for all auto dial functions. Campuses are able to send out alerts and notices through either phone message, text or email to parents and students in the district. Administrators are able to access the system through desktop, mobile app and phone in method.

Mr. Miller presented a Transportation safety power point to the committee that discussed driver requirements, training provided, routing system, student tracker software and safety of the bus fleet.

Mr. Miller led a discussion regarding the Train Derailment plan at Barrow Elementary. Feedback was provided by committee members in updating the plan for the 22-23 school year.

Coach Mascheck presented the Athletic Health Emergency plan to the committee.

Mary McCarthy, principal of Wild Peach Elementary discussed concerns about traffic safety in front of Wild Peach. Committee discussed possible solutions to address this issue.

Caleb McCain, Assistant Principal Columbia High School, addressed safety concerns regarding camera blind spots at CHS. Mr. McCain also discussed vape sensors.

Mr. Miller presented information regarding the class of 2022 Safety Officer Interaction Training. Chief Sanders stated that 100% of the class of 2022 has met this requirement.

Mr. Miller discussed updated to Stop-the-Bleed training. All staff are required to attend training and discussed what that would look like on the campus level. Mr. Miller also discussed how that would be transitioned down to the student population.

Chief Sanders discussed CBISD crimestoppers and their progress to date. This year crimestoppers has paid out over \$2000 in tips.

Chief Sanders presented information regarding the truancy officer that was hired this year. Officer has made over 1500 home visits this past year for truancy issues.

Safety and Security Partners presented updates.

Mr. Miller made a motion to adjourn meeting at 5:05pm. Second by Chief Sanders. Motion passed unanimously.
